2. Matters arising from Meeting on 29 May 2025

- 1. The Minutes and the two presentations were uploaded on the ISM website
- 2. Members were requested to share their country practices through presentations to ISM2

3. Feedback on the ISM Presidium Meeting and Scientific Seminar in Kraków, Poland (6 – 8 July 2025)

- 1. Host was Prof. Agnieszka Malinowska from AGH University
- Day 1: Several presentations from Chinese delegation on monitoring and mapping of Coal mine subsidence and TSFs, in addition to Talent development in China. Followed by an Icebreaker meeting
- 3. Day 2: Presidium meeting Country and ISM Commissions reported on their status and work, followed by the Scientific seminar on Mining Surveying and Geohazards: Current Trends and Future Directions. Day 2 ended with a traditional Polish dinner in a Tayern in the Old Town
- 4. Day 3: Presidium meeting continued. Important decision:
 Regarding Mine Surveying Education, Training and Professional practice (Licensing). Several countries raised concern on the shortage of licenced, practicing mine surveyors. A decision was made that the 2026 Conference in Cape Town must have a special session on this topic. ISM members are encouraged to submit papers and present country updates at the conference. Day 3 ended with a visit to Wieliczka Salt Mine, followed by (an underground) dinner

The presentation was followed by several questions and a good technical discussion. The Members present expressed appreciation for an interesting and relevant presentation. The global scarcity of mineral deposits and the high gold prices are causing companies to reevaluate old and closed mines. The survey, geology and valuation considerations for re-starting such mines, as explained by Messrs Visser and Bals, are significant.

Professor Preuße suggested that presentations to ISM should be made available to students, who can be invited to attend. The Working Committee undertook to investigate this further.

We will continue with one presentation at ISM2 meetings, allowing more time for in-depth discussions and questions.
